The digital haves and have-nots

The internet has been a big help for families with schoolchildren at home during lockdown. But not every child in Maindee has been able to benefit from this. One East Newport primary school reports that 28% of their children have no suitable devices or internet at home. Another school has a worse position with almost half (46%) of their children having no home access.

A group of East Newport organisations have now got together to try to tackle this shortfall. Wastesavers and Medrau Maindee Makers will be converting old laptops into chromebooks (the devices of choice for schools) and a fundraising campaign is being developed to pay the internet connection costs for up to 200 children.

Reopening Llyfrgell Maindee Library+

It is hoped that plans will be in place to reopen the library at the start of September. To ensure a safe and secure environment for volunteers and library users, a number of changes need to take place. Use of hand sanitiser, disposable gloves and face coverings will be part of the 'new normal', as will increased cleaning and surface sanitising procedures. The management board are also considering:

- A change to opening times
- A change to the layout of the building: using the kitchen as a reception and limiting the number of computers in use at any one time
- Introduction of contactless payment
