Maindee Food Trail is open from 6pm to 9pm on Friday 10th October. Last entry is 8pm. A £12 ticket will give you a chance to enjoy a menu of six tasters at 6 different venues, Basir's Bakery, Tarana Indian Restaurant, Valentines, Mamu's Chai, Re D'Oro Italian Restaurant, and Maindee Fresh Foods.

It's a real bargain and a fun way to enjoy tasters of the amazing world food on our doorstep. On the eve of Newport's food festival, this Maindee event is the first ever food trail in the city. Tickets are limited so book as soon as possible by using the QR code on the right hand page or by emailing admin@maindee.org.

Ticket holders can pickup up their passes, maps and eating kits from Maindee Library. The trail will take at least an hour to complete.

Shop Talk

For ages the Papa Johns pizza shop at 94 Chepstow Road had a big poster in the window saying "Newport - sorry to leave you". Clearly, they were very sorry about this as the franchise has just reopened in the same premises. At the other end of the street, Fireway (another national pizza franchise) is about to open next to Ozzys. After a flurry of new chicken shops, like Chicky Fridays and Chixy Chicken, it seems that pizza shops are in the ascendancy.

The Cazers building was demolished ages ago leaving a big gap so it's good to see building work on the site at last. Next door to this, Tarana has just opened in the former Tamarind premises. It specialises in authentic Indian/Bangladeshi cuisine. It's the company's first Welsh restaurant and has already won Best Newcomer in Wales at Tommy Miah's International Indian Chef and Hospitality Awards. Not a bad start. Aghrahr, next to Weatherspoons, is another new South Asian restaurant with a focus on authenticity - this time focussing on the southern Indian cuisine of Kerala.

Basir's Bakery has recently opened at 80 Chepstow Road (opposite the library). Open every day until 11pm, it offers sweet and savoury snacks, milkshakes, mocktails bubble tea and hot drinks. It has a friendly family vibe and looks like it could become a cool hang-out spot. Worth checking out.




Maindee volunteers

Nevil who owns Maindee Fresh Foods has been delivering business advice and consultancy for 20 years.



The future of the Centre had been uncertain for years. There was talk of it being demolished. **Greening Maindee volunteers** have recently been maintaining the grounds but the buildings had been getting very run down. Following a "community asset transfer" agreement with Newport City Council and a grant from

the UK Government, TOCH is now leasing the Centre and managing a £300000 refurbishment project.



Work was due to start in August and finish this December. As often happens, these dates have now slipped and It looks like the Centre will not be fully up and running until the New Year. But it surely will be worth the wait. When more and more community buildings, halls and libraries are closing, it is such good news that Eveswell is being saved from the brink. Well done everybody - now let's make a real go of it!
