

Llyfrgell Maindee Library

Llyfrgell Maindee Library is a welcoming place. It's easy to join to borrow books and it is a comfy and safe place to do your homework, hotdesk or just to relax. Wifi and computer access is free. If you have never visited, or it's been a long time, why not to pop in to have a look around. We are pretty sure you will be pleasantly surprised. You will find us next to the Police Station at 79 Chepstow Road.

In 2015, though, things were not so rosy. In April that year Newport City Council announced that "Followina the conclusion of the review into library services, Maindee Library and Information Centre will close to the public on Saturday 29th August 2015." It was awful news. The library had been there since the 1930s. Many people were shocked that such a cherished institution could close. Sometimes things like this spur people into action. A packed public meeting agreed that the newlyformed charity, Maindee Unlimited, could have a go at running the library. A group of founder volunteers from the charity then re-opened the library on 31st October.

It is often the case that voluntary projects start well but soon run out of steam. One of the reasons this has not happened has been the sheer quality and diversity of volunteers. Another reason is that the "parent" charity, Maindee Unlimited, had policy and fundraising arrangements already in place from day one. It has meant

that library volunteers have not had to worry about fundraising to pay the bills. Ten years on, the library continues to actively serve the Maindee community. Books are loaned; computers and wifi are well used.

Alongside its main functions, the space also hosts Maindee Food Pantry and a range of weekly and monthly classes and groups.

Pop into the library this Summer and join the Summer Book Challenge. We will give you a card to complete when you finish the challenges. They are easy and, don't worry, we can help if you get stuck. One you have finished you can have a beautiful new book to keep. We have books suitable for all ages.

Maindee Gateway Garden

A blank gable end and a muddy patch of grass have been completely transformed into a new public garden on the junction of Wharf Road and Chepstow Road.

A circular seating area sits at the heart of the "Maindee Gateway Garden". The top of the seats have been made by Reseiclo from hardwood. The wooden slats are fixed onto a base framework of galvanized cages filled with round stones. The surrounding trees, hedges, hostas, grasses and ferns all help to soften and bind the space.

It has been a big project for Greening Maindee. The funding from the UK Government's Shared Prosperity Fund was secured in early 2024. The team later also managed to get sponsorship from Pobl and Hedyn. Newport City Council, who own the land, administered the SPF grant process and helped sort out permissions.

Emily Crowley-Wroe, the professional designer, has done a great job. She has worked closely with, mural artist, Andy O'Rourke to visually tie together the garden with Andy's

wildlife mural on the gable end. Emily's design was selected for the RHS Malvern Spring Garden Show – where it won a silver medal.

After Malvern, a team of landscapers removed the garden from the showground and brought all the plants, boulders and cages to Maindee for permanent installation. **Greening Maindee volunteers** have now finished this in time for the grand opening on 20th June. Gardeners' World presenter, Sue Kent, is cutting the ribbon.



"Now it's all about enjoying the garden and maintaining its high standard" said John Stone, Greening Maindee Co-ordinator. "That means lots of watering, litter picking, weeding and seasonal re-planting. We hope lots of people will want to help to keep it looking good" he added.

The Gateway Garden is the latest of a growing number of public gardens, community orchards and planting boxes that have been installed and maintained by Greening Maindee volunteers.
