The BIG IDEA is for everyone to start growing SUNFLOWERS now, so that by the end of August we can hold **PETAL POWER MAINDEE FESTIVAL**, with the streets of Maindee filled with sunflowers plus:

- decorated shop windows (shopkeepers please note). &
- giant flower structures (feel free to make one for your street).

You can get free packs of Maindee sunflower seeds from Maindee Fish Bar, Chepstow Road Post Office, Corpa Road Post Office, Premier on Church Road, Tesco's Caerleon Road, The Farmhouse Bakery and Maindee Handyman. If you can't get to the shops, text or ring 07925 436903 and we can drop seeds off to you. Plant seeds in a big pot, or in a front garden, watch out for slug attacks, water your sunflowers very well and let's help create a blooming lovely Maindee.

During early August there will be on-line flower making workshops to show you how to make flower decorations for your front garden from recycled and other materials. **Over the weekend of August 22nd/23rd there will be an online children's festival and music event.**

Newport City Council supports Maindee Triangle plan

You may have read in the Argus that NCC have given Maindee Unlimited the go ahead to take a "Community Asset Transfer" lease on Maindee Triangle. This little corner park, that sits at the junction of Livingstone Place and Chepstow Road, has been run down since the public toilets on the site closed in November 2017. As part of the new Greening Maindee strategy, one of the priorities for us will be to get the outdoor space working for the community. We are also planning to re-provide public toilets (flushed with rainwater!) and develop a smart new community meeting room. It is all very exciting stuff!

Bundles of help for pregnant women



Are you pregnant? Do you need a bit of a hand? Have you got some volunteering time to donate? Do you need some baby clothes? Bundles is a local voluntary group that supports women and families during pregnancy and birth. They collect pre-loved baby clothes (up to 24 months), maternity clothes and equipment like breast pumps. These are then passed onto low income/ refugee/asylum seeking/ women in need. Bundles are happy to provide you with support or to hear from you if you have 30 minutes or more a week to join their growing network of volunteers. Tea is always available (and sometimes lovely cake).
